Headline figures compared to similar schools

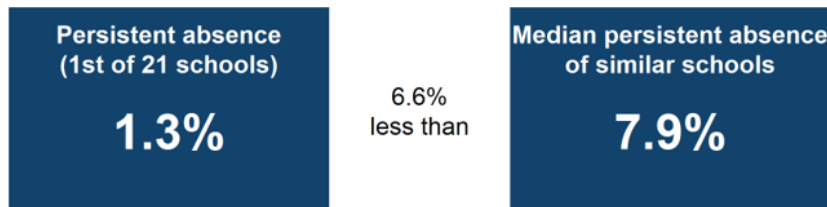

Overall attendance



Your overall attendance is 97.1% which is 1.2% greater than the median attendance of similar schools. You are ranked 3rd of 21 schools for attendance - meaning 18 similar schools have a lower overall attendance than your school.

Persistent Absence



Your persistent absence is 1.3% which is 6.6% less than the median attendance of similar schools. You are ranked 1st of 21 schools for persistent absence - meaning 20 similar schools have a higher rate of persistent absence than your school.
